Treasurers Report

2022 FY (Financial Year) was a year of consolidation and exploration. The settled programs of SIL, Brookes and Community access have continued to provide quality outcomes, while the start of the Here Now Next project is a new avenue for Equity Works to provide opportunity and choice for people with disability.

Equity Works posted a net surplus of \$450,728. This was a decrease of 30% on the 2021FY. The net surplus decrease was largely due to decreased support for COVID-19. The Here Now Next program also had a significant impact with a contribution of \$235,457. Excluding Here Now Next, Equity Works had an underlying operating surplus of \$215,217 this represents a 4% net profit margin.

NDIS income increased by 5%. This includes the one-off government payment of \$170,000 that was received in August 2022. This funding was in recognition of the added costs that NDIS providers incurred as a result of COVID-19 over the 2022 FY.

Employee expenses was the largest item of expenditure, being 91% of total expenses. The proportion of total expenses stayed consistent with last year, however the amount spent increased by 11%. This includes an additional investment in training wages of \$55,000. The number of employees increased from 77 at the beginning of the financial year to 86 at the end.

The Association continues to maintain good financial health. Total Equity rose to \$4.8 million, with \$4.1 million held in cash. Equity Works could pay its ordinary expenses for 37 weeks without receiving any income before exhausting this reserve.

The quick ratio remained steady at 1:4. This is a solvency ratio that measures an organisation's ability to pay its short-term debts. It shows that Equity Works could pay its short-term debts four times over and thus could sustain considerable volatility in trading conditions and still keep its solvency.

The following Audited Financial Statements give the full detail of the organisation's financial position. I would like to thank the Equity Works Finance Team for their diligent oversight of financial matters. I would also like to thank Moore Australia for the high standard and the professionalism of their audit work over many years.

From the Chief Executive Officer and President

Presented at the Annual General Meeting, 17th November 2022

Reporting Year—July 2021 to June 2022

As we moved out of the most intense period of the management of Covid 19, we focused on continuity of support. No new major services were added in the 2021-2022 period. Our existing services continued to strive to provide quality services with reliability and flexibility.

Brookes Street House provided 475 nights of support with 89 nights away from the house base provided to small groups participating in a range of novel experiences (camping, trips to the city, mountain getaways). The team continued to provide a small school holiday program for young people familiar with the service we provide.

Our community based supports continued steadily with over 20,000 hours of support provided to around 40 people. These supports are often provided 1:1 based on the client requirements, however we continue to seek opportunities to create meaningful opportunities for shared supports to foster social connections and assist with cost effective utilisation of each person's NDIS plan.

We continued to support seven people in four households in Supported Independent Living arrangements. Supported Independent Living is a service we continue to receive enquiries about.

We will seek to increase our capacity in the following year with a view to supporting more people in this important service. In the 2021/2022 reporting year we have continued to support people in other aspects of managing their NDIS plans, with active Support Coordination and Plan Management services.

The Here Now Next project has received an extension of time and we look forward to continuing to learn how best to support young people with disabilities secure meaningful paid employment. An area of participation that has seen little improvement over a number of decades. Our team are enthusiastic about the Customised Employment approach and the opportunity it offers for change in employee/employer outcomes.



From the Chief Executive Officer and President

Presented at the Annual General Meeting, 17th November 2022

We have found time to celebrate and connect with a number of events, large and small.

Artworkz was hosted in September 2021. A great collaboration between community organisations Equity Works and Spiral with nineteen artists presenting their work to the public at the Coolum Civic Centre on 11 September 2021. Attendance and sales were strong with more than \$3000.00 worth of sales passed onto the exhibiting artists.

Equity Works has led the free community event A Fair Day Out each year since 2013. We were unable to host the event in 2020 due to Covid 19 considerations. It was wonderful to be back in song, dance, and play on Saturday 9th October 2021. Hundreds of people with disability and their supporters gathered at the Eumundi Markets to create and celebrate inclusive communities.

In November 2021, we hosted more than 150 members of the Equity Works family, past and present, at the organisation 21st Birthday Celebration at The Shed, located at Aussie World. With entertainment by The Sunshine Troupe and The Outsiders, it was a lovely way to celebrate with clients, families, staff and community partners.

We look forward with goals of continuing to provide quality services that are individualised to the person and family we are supporting. We aspire to creating, with people we support, opportunities for connection and contribution in all aspects of community life. To achieve this we recognise the value of each member of the staff team who everyday contribute to the capability of the organisation to progress it's Vision and Mission.

We thank the eighty plus members of the Equity Works team who take forward the organisation values to their daily supports.

At this Annual General Meeting, on behalf of the Management Committee we express deepest thanks and gratitude to Jean Prentis for her service as a volunteer Committee Member of the organisation since it's incorporation in 2000. Jean has decided the time has come to resign her position on the Committee to more fully enjoy more of the pursuits that bring her joy in retirement.

Focus on Individuals

In 2021 to 2022, we continued to deliver NDIS funded services and to work with our clients to design small group programs that deliver opportunities for individual expression and growth. Some groups form for a small time around shared goals, others are more permanent and support the development of long term friendships amongst members, including Art By Friends (since 2017) and Hunters and Gatherers (since 2019).





One of the longest serving staff members retired in May 2022. Helen provided deeply caring and thoughtful service for 18 years in her role as Lifestyle Facilitator and was warmly farewelled into retirement by other members of the Supported Independent Living Team. Thank you Helen!!

In 2021 to 2022, we continued to support two community based Yoga classes. These classes are open to the public, hosted in community venues, with minimal cost to participate.

Inclusive Yoga, is led by Equity Works staff member Alli, a qualified yoga teacher with extensive experience working as an occupational therapist. Alli has designed a gentle class in which the students use the support of a chair throughout the class. Yoga for Everybody, led by Saya, is a partnership between Equity Works and The Yoga Impact Charity. Saya is a yoga teacher with a focus on mental health and meditation. Saya has created a calming, inclusive and gentle yoga to nourish the mind and uplift the spirits.






ABOUT THE TEACHER:
